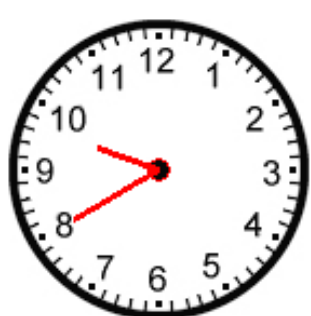

We can vividly recall Sept 11th 2001 when many eyes all around the world watched on TV in shock and disbelief, as we see two planes carrying passengers smash right into the Twin Towers in New York. The SARS epidemic hit Singapore right at her core. Shopping malls and clinics were deserted. Fear took hold of the island for 2 full months.

In Matthew 24, Jesus took great pains to share with his disciples details of event and trend signs that will take place before His return. These include earthquakes, wars and rumors of wars, pestilence and persecutions.


Jesus continued by warning that many would be caught unaware when He returns. He compared the days of His return to those of Noah. While Noah was building the ark, no one took heed or responded to his warnings. Imagine someone in our time spending many years building a large ship in the middle of the Great Sahara desert. Won't it catch your attention and curiosity?

“Why are you doing this Noah? Whatever for?”

“The flood is coming! The flood is coming!” Noah warned.

But no one took heed. Many thought Noah was crazy, because it had never rained in their times! They carried on with their lives as per normal, continued in their merriment, eating drinking and marrying right up to the day Noah entered the ark. The moment Noah entered the Ark and closed the door, it's too late!
